

PARKVIEW TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

In our last Community Newsletter, we introduced you to the *Parkview Traffic Safety Committee (PTSC)*, who is advocating for the implementation of neighbourhood traffic safety measures on behalf of the *Parkview Community League* and its members.

On July 8, 2016, the PTSC recognized that the controlled intersection at 145 Street and 91 Avenue had been freshly repainted and larger traffic control signs around the intersection had been installed. In addition, the School Zone designation has been applied and signs installed along 91 Avenue, between 142 Street and 145 Street. Ken Karunaratne, a City of Edmonton, Senior Traffic Engineer, helped facilitate the School Zone designation so that we could avoid an onerous jurisdictional appeal to the province.


These are two significant milestones achieved that, in turn, allows us to remove one of our recommended Traffic Management Measures as this request would have placed extraordinary burdens on Parkview School and students to dramatically expand its Crossing Guard program.

"That the Principal of the Parkview Elementary Junior High School assign two additional Crossing Guard squads to patrol the 91 Avenue and 145 Street intersection and 91 Avenue and 143 Street intersection, for the upcoming 2016/2017 School Year"

(Recommended Traffic Measures PTSC Discussion Guide; p.3)

At *Parkview's Annual Summer Solstice Food Truck Event*, the PTSC distributed a traffic safety infographic leaflet to and collected names and email addresses from over four hundred neighbourhood and resident guests. The key message was that *only 38% of drivers comply with present neighbourhood traffic measures* – a statistic validated by our own data collection. In addition, a member of the PTSC will now coordinate the Community League sign to regularly configure messages promoting traffic safety. And, *we are committed to holding a stakeholders meeting in late September* for community members to learn about, consider, and recommend traffic safety measures throughout Parkview, given the systemic nature of this issue.

It is with your inspiration and support that Parkview aspires to *Vision Zero* – that no loss of life is acceptable. We are sharing this vision with our children, parents, our school teachers, neighbourhood healthcare professionals, business owners and entrepreneurs, community organizers, political representatives and all other concerned citizens. *The Mayor and City Council has fully-endorsed Vision Zero as its Edmonton Road Safety Strategy* (2016 – 2020). As drivers, "we are human and make mistakes. The road system needs to keep us moving. But it must also be designed to protect us at every turn."

From 6:45 to 8:00 on Thursday nights from September to June, women of all ages and skill levels meet at Lynnwood Elementary School (though sometimes we get bumped to a different school). Of 25 semi-regulars, 6 to 16 people show up on a night. Player's ages range from 20 to 60+.

Each night, we divide people into two teams. Regardless of skill level, everyone gets passed to and encouraged. The score? Who knows – we don't keep track. When anyone gets a basket, we all cheer.

Everyone plays at their own level. The most skilled players compete hard against each other, but ease off against the rest of us. When there are more than 10 people, everyone subs off evenly.

Games are often interrupted for laugh breaks. It's great exercise, and there is lots of joy and laughter. I reluctantly went to my first one, and years later, I still love Ladies Sports Nite and the wonderful people who come to play.

Our fee for the year is \$50. Fees cover gym rental, equipment, and some refreshments for a Christmas party and a windup party.

Come and try it for free for a couple of nights and see if you like it. You owe it to yourself and your family to be the happiest you can be. Think of it as a cheap happy pill without adverse side effects.
