Voting in an election is **YOUR DEMOCRATIC RIGHT** and your choice. Our city and our lives will be shaped by the outcome of the 2017 Edmonton Election.

Casting your ballot for mayor, city councillor, and school board trustee means you are participating in choosing the leaders that will make decisions about policies and programs that impact your daily life.

- You are a Canadian citizen.
- You have lived in Alberta since April 16, 2017.



The PVCL Board is proposing new bylaws, to be voted on at the October AGM. They will replace the badly out-of-date 1963 version. Copies have been given to many members and are also available on the website www.pvcl.ca.

Here is a summary of the key changes.

- 1. Remove the requirement for an expensive annual audit of the books, shifting instead to an independent review by qualified persons. The reviewed statements will be available prior to the AGM. If members have concerns and wish an audit to take place, they can request that at the AGM.
- 2. Clauses added as required by the Societies Act (eg an indemnification clause). Clauses eliminated if they are duplicated in the Act. Just-in-case "insurance" clauses added to prevent paralysis in unlikely scenarios such as bankruptcy, dissolution, lack of quorum at an AGM or mass resignation of a Board. Most of these we have been asked to add by the provincial person that will review and approve our new Bylaws.
- 3. Reference membership in the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues, and the relatively new Tripartite agreement between leagues, the EFCL and the City. The Tripartite Agreement itself includes a number of rights and responsibilities, and to eliminate potential conflict, we took care to make sure these have not been duplicated in the new Bylaws.
- 4. Upcoming budget now required to be circulated to members prior to the AGM. AGM date set within two months of fiscal year end. Major capital projects funded by the Casino Fund and any operating item more than 10% of the total will be discussed and approved at the AGM.
- 5. Correct Fiscal yearend to August 31st, a date that has been used for many years, but is officially October 9th in the old bylaws. No one remembers when or how that happened!
- 6. Old Bylaws call for monthly meetings of the entire membership in addition to the annual general meeting (AGM). The proposal shifts responsibility for ongoing decisions to the Board. Meetings open to all members. This shift just sets down in writing what has been common practice for decades. However, we also propose to shift the power to borrow money from the Board to the membership at a General Meeting (annual or special, as needed).
- 7. Board reduced from 12 to 7, and eliminates the designated committee names, eg Entertainment Sports Publicity, allowing more flexibility. Adds an Executive Committee (President VP Secretary Treasurer) to make decisions between meetings and then ratify them at the next meeting.
- 8. Board member terms now all one year, avoiding any stagger mechanism.
- 9. Set quorum for Board meetings to 50% +1 instead of the 8 it now is. Current number has led to numerous noquorum situations. Quorum for General meetings changed from just 8 members to 10% of members (we currently have about 150 members). Quorum for Special Meetings/Resolutions are defined in the Societies Act.
- 10. Add ability for official communication via email and proxy voting.
- 11. Insert an edited version of the currently separate Mission/Goals/Objectives document into the Bylaws, to give it more weight. Edited, at least in part, to provide more flexibility to future boards.

If you approve of the proposal, please also email Ray. We want to know if there is support for the proposed changes.

A special resolution to approve this proposal will be on the agenda at the **OCTOBER 17, 2017 AGM**. We want your input over the summer so we can make necessary revisions.

Late registrations will be accepted from September 1, 2017 and players will be placed on available teams. Season starts the weekend of October 14th and runs until February 2018.






