PARKVIEW COMMUNITY LEAGUE BOARD UPDATE

HAPPY FALL PARKVIEW RESIDENTS!

Looking back over the summer, it was so refreshing to see so many families enjoying the parkland and Community Hall. We hosted Green Shack again for July and August, and the Edmonton Folk Festival provided a free "Taking it to the Streets" concert in late July. In the fall, there was an all ages paint event at the hall. Indoor soccer has begun and we have a mixed U7 team as well as a Girls U14 team representing Parkview.

The AGM was on October 19th and was hosted virtually again. The support documents can be found on the pvcl.ca website. We would like to thank our new joining board members Ben Jasper and Rhett Nickerson, and our returning board members Jimmy Arlia, April Grzech, Lisa Day, Nicole Darsaut, and Rebecca Goldsack. There were 23 people in attendance including guests Sarah Hamilton, our new City Councillor, and Randy Boissonnault, our new MP, who generously offered assistance to our ORC.

We are heading into some challenging financial times. It's more important than ever before that we are cautious with our expenses. Our Year End balance sheet indicates that the PVCL's net income for August 2020 - August 2021 was a deficit of \$34,559.02, which is alarming since our operating account cannot support another year of that kind of deficit.

Many privileges that residents all benefit from for free actually cost the league money: Green Shack, portable toilets, food truck events, and the rinks, just to name a few from this newsletter alone. Providing programming in the hall at a reduced rate or free still costs the league as the hall has utility and caretaker costs, plus the loss of potential rental revenue from a private rental during the same time. These privileges are the direct result of income the league receives from private rentals, casinos, memberships, and operating grants from the City of Edmonton. The PVCL strives to offer as many benefits as possible to Parkview residents. However, our income ultimately determines how much we can offer.

To provide some insight for the decrease in income, casinos have been delayed from all the closures (which typically bring in \$75,000 every 2 years). We anticipate our next casino to be this spring. We have never completely closed the Community Hall, so there are minimal expenses associated with that (the idea being we were ready to accept programming as soon as restrictions changed). Since the restrictions were lifted in July, the hall has been used similarly to before COVID-19.

As for expenses, we've seen some significant increases. Utility costs have gone up. The rink historically costs \$11,000 to \$22,000 which includes water for flooding, snow clearing, and board repair. Last year, the board was concerned about the safety of the rink. Those safety concerns are increased this year as more boards are rotting and damaged, not to mention the potential that the rink expenses could cost up to half of what is in the operating account. The board voted to close both rinks this winter season and instead focus that money on the new rink. This is a small sacrifice to help ensure the ORC can continue their work. The Outdoor Revitalization Committee has been busy navigating event postponements, grant applications, and casino promises. Construction is still planned to start in the spring of 2022. Every donation helps! Please see their article in this newsletter for their update.

In summary, the board will continue to provide transparent financial updates to Parkview residents and we welcome new board members at any time (not just at the AGM) to help support the wonderful programs and benefits the PVCL can offer our community. Have a safe winter!



UPCOMING EVENTS: Parkview Rinks Winter Closure

It has been a tough couple of years for all, including the Parkview Community League. When we were faced with the decision to keep the community hall open during the pandemic, we decided to leave it open for the community, but it had to come with a cost. Despite being available for bookings, the COVID-19 pandemic ultimately led to a significant loss of revenue for the community hall. This decrease in rental income, combined with an aging rink in need of significant repairs to be safe, resulted in careful consideration of whether it was viable to operate the rink for the upcoming winter season.

Nobody wants to eliminate community services, but given the unprecedented financial pressures, the board believes the repair and operational expenses are better directed to support the Outdoor Revitalization Committee (ORC). For these reasons, the Parkview Community League Board has voted to suspend rink services for the 2021-2022 winter season. This is not a decision that was taken lightly, and we understand the disappointment this will cause. The rinks have been a pillar in the community for decades, but we have a bright future on the horizon thanks to the ORC. We thank you for understanding, and our volunteers remain committed to the responsible development of our community.

Frequently Asked Questions!

1. I've lived in this community for 30 years and we've always had a rink!

The rink was built in 1956 and requires significant costly repairs to be safe enough for use. The board decided those resources would be better redirected to support the ORC.

2. Why can't you just flood the tennis courts? / Why can't you just flood the hockey rink?

Flooding only one of the areas does not result in significant cost savings and the board felt it was more prudent to instead dedicate those resources to the ORC.

3. I will personally pay for the rink repairs and maintenance fees.

That is very generous of you, but the operation of the community league hall and surrounding property is the financial and legal responsibility of the board. Continued use of the aging rink is not a risk the board is willing to incur. We encourage you to instead donate to the ORC.

4. I pay my membership fees every year - that isn't how I want my community league run!

We thank you for your continued support. We encourage all community members to volunteer time to community league activities, whether it is being a board member, organizing an event, coaching community sports, or volunteering some time at one of the many events held throughout the year.
