#### **PARKVIEW ROYALTY**

Last issue's story, "Queen of Parkview" naming the longest continuous resident of our community appears to have been a bit premature. Since the article was published we have heard from two more candidates!

One moved here in December 1954 and the other in March 1955, and there may be more, Parkview appears to attract loyalty!

One of contenders would have arrived earlier but construction of their home was delayed for a reason the current generation likely won't understand; it was too cold to complete the plastering (Google it!) and there was no electricity to provide additional heat.

In 1955, there were no sidewalks, nor even any streets to speak of. No stores, and the closest school was Crestwood. Before Andy's IGA opened in 1965, the closest grocery store was a little Safeway located in the building that is now our local McDonalds. The area was a mud-hole once the spring thaw came. Residents had to park on 142 st. or 149 st. and walk to their homes, it sure made for an easy way to get to know neighbours... no fences or garages existed at that time either.

The couple who arrived in 1954 (name withheld by request) sold their home in 1991 and moved to an acreage, but missed Parkview so much they moved back only a few months later.

Which means.... drumroll, please... Erich

(90) and Anna (92) Schmidt appear to be the longest continuous residents of Parkview.

Erich was one of the founding members of the Crestwood Curling Club and the Schmidt family were great supporters of our Community League once it got started in 1960.

And consider this... the Schmidts have lived in the same home for so long that they have replaced their roof and furnace at least four times. Solid construction (fir joists) have made for a sturdy structure that they have renovated inside and out, and enjoyed for 64 years continuously!
