Our students have been busy this spring working on fantastic art projects, preparing for big Mothers' and Fathers' Day celebrations, and learning about their community and city. The 4 year students just completed a special book project facilitated by Studio Art Sessions. The students made beautiful book keepsakes. Here is some information on the project:

RELIEF PRINTMAKING: "My Moody Monster Book"

Program of Study Connections: Visual Art, Language Art Media and Technique: Relief Printmaking, Collage

Students begin this journey with a brief history of the "who, what, where, when and why" of printmaking and how artists have used this medium to tell stories and communicate over time. Each child will create their own "monster matrix" using scratch foam. The image is printed into a small folded book format using collage, brayers, and printing ink. The art fundamentals of line, shape, colour, and texture are the focus, as well as the influence they have on changing and creating the mood of a story when the printed image remains constant.

Final Product: A fabric covered booklet with 4 printed images on collaged mixed media paper.

QUESTIONS I'M ASKED ABOUT FEEDING BIRDS

Q: When should I put my hummingbird feeder out?

By the time you read this article the hummers will already have crossed into the province after having migrated up through the southern states from their winter stay in Central America. We can expect to see returning Ruby-throated Hummingbirds around May 10 this year. It's a good idea to get your feeders filled and ready to put out shortly after May 5. The reason to put them out this early is so that the males, who usually

arrive before the females, will see your feeder as they begin passing through looking for territories with good food supplies. Most hummingbirds recognize feeders as sources of food as they have either been shown them by their mothers, or have used them on their journey south on migration. It's good to use a feeder that is easy to fill and clean, and one that allows you to see the bird regardless of where it is on the feeder. The nectar they need is easy to prepare, I part granulated white sugar mixed with 4 parts warm water, to help it dissolve-no food colouring. Keep some in the fridge to make it easy to refill the feeder.

Q: Do I need to feed the birds this spring and summer?

Springtime for birds means a shift from focusing purely on survival to propagation of the species. What we see now is the return of summer birds, more courting behaviour between male and female birds, checking out of nesting boxes, and building nests. Access

to abundant and healthy food supplies is important to birds...regardless of the season. Bird feeders allow birds to spend less time foraging for food and more time engaging in activities that enhance their health and safety. It does not make them too lazy, or too dependent. These misconceptions have been dispelled by modern research and observation. Bird feeders can play an important role in maintaining some populations of birds where less natural food is available. During nesting season adult birds with a backyard food supply have more time to select better nesting sites and construct higher quality nests. And more food for adult birds means the chicks also receive more food, can be healthier, and are more likely to survive.

Q: Do we get Cardinals in Alberta?

These beautiful birds are originally native of the American South but are now present in most areas of Eastern Canada with the occasional rare sighting in Alberta. The hotspot for Central Alberta is Sherwood Park where there have been at least one, and perhaps as many as three, breeding pairs of Northern Cardinals. A Sherwood Park couple who are long time bird feeders had a male show up at their feeder starting in 2006. He persisted until a female arrived in 2008. Magic happened and a chick from the union was feeding from their bird feeder in 2009. Since then the frequency of sightings has increased slowly. At the store, we've had reports of Cardinal sightings by customers in Redwater, Gibbons, Fort Saskatchewan, Strathcona County, and Sherwood Park confirming that area as the one to watch for growth in the breeding population. There have been occasional sightings in the City of Edmonton and just west of Devon. If you have seen a Northern Cardinal, we'd love to hear from you.



As you read this issue, I'm hopeful the unseasonable January thaw continues into February and March. Enough with needing the

furnace already! Spring into action before the hot weather arrives and get the most out of your A/C this year. How to do your annual A/C maintenance? Here's how: Turn off the power to the furnace and A/C. Check and replace your furnace filter if required — check it monthly. Check the humidifier pad for calcium build up; replace if required and close its damper and valve. Flush the A/C evaporator coil

drain line (above furnace) with a bleach and water solution; check it for flow. Look at the underside of the evaporator coil and drain pan for debris or dust; clean if required. Make sure the A/C condenser (outside) is on a solid, level pad, with 2 feet of space around it. Inspect the condenser for debris and dust; vacuum as required and clean the coils with an approved coil cleaner; flush with water. Turn on the power to the furnace and A/C. With the thermostat in "cooling mode", test the A/C's operation; only when it's above 15 degrees outside. Now you're all set to be cool!
