As the Parkview Community League coordinated with the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues in May to provide space for evacuees from the devastating fires in Fort McMurray, the neighbourhood sprang into action collecting cash donations, non-perishable food items, bottled water, baby/infant/toddler supplies and strollers, new bedding, clothing, comfort and relief items to people who have lost everything – all within 24 hours of a few Facebook posts.

On Friday May 6th, the residents of Parkview and Valleyview showed up to the community hall with vehicles full of supplies for the evacuated residents of Fort McMurray. Thanks to social media and generous, caring donors, we had an amazing response with less than one day's notice. It was truly overwhelming.

Almost 50 families came out to donate and help with organizing the donations.

We rallied drivers to deliver donations to the Edmonton Food Bank and the Edmonton Emergency Relief Services Society (EERSS). Cash donations for the Red Cross, Edmonton Food Bank, and Gift Cards for the evacuees were also collected and delivered.

They neither wanted nor asked for our gratitude or recognition but on behalf of our entire community thank you for being the catalysts who enable the rest of us to help out, thank you to **JODY NICKERSON** and **LAURA VERBEEK** for organizing this relief effort. Fort McMurray families thank you. Edmontonians thank you. Parkview thanks you.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

According to the 2013 General Social Survey of Giving, Volunteering, and Participating, “a lack of time” was the leading barrier to volunteering. It is safe to say, we can all relate. Almost 80% of people who have not yet volunteered said that “not being asked” or “not knowing how to get involved” were big barriers to participating. We can relate to that, too. The first introductions are sometimes the toughest. When Gillian and I attended our first community league meeting a couple of years ago we knew no one but have met so many friends and neighbours because of it.

The best result of this survey is that when asked for their motivations, 93% of volunteers wanted to contribute to the well-being of their community – practically unanimous. 77% of volunteers desired to use their skills and experience; 60% felt personally affected by the cause. Whether it is to network, to support your friends and neighbours, or to seek new experiences, you will find like-minded and generous people at the *Parkview Community League*.

Please receive this as my invitation and request to become involved in the well-being of your community. Please volunteer on our board. We require a diversity of skills, ages and stages that can be applied to the cause that connects us - Parkview. In addition to the outstanding annual events for which this neighbourhood is becoming renowned (e.g., the Summer Food Truck Event; the Halloween Ball; the Christmas Craft Sale), your community league is engaging locally with residents and city officials over lot subdivision, traffic safety measures*, and development standards relating to the Mature Neighbourhood Overlay (MNO). 

PARKVIEW TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

Over the last few years, traffic safety measures in Crestwood, along 95 Avenue, have been so effective that commuters are now short-cutting and speeding through Parkview school zones. Community members have raised concerns about speeding along 145 and 146 streets; cars not stopping at the intersection of 91 Avenue and 145 Street, and increased neighbourhood volume as drivers use 88 Avenue to bypass rush hour traffic. As a result, many parents in our neighbourhood feel their kids are unable to safely walk to school. In fact, on many occasions parents have witnessed vehicles jumping ahead of them and their children to try to beat them across the intersection at the four way stop!

In response, the Parkview Community League has formed a Traffic Safety Committee to develop and propose a neighbourhood strategy for consideration by City Council and Administration. A draft discussion guide has been developed and traffic monitoring has begun.

QUESTIONS ABOUT FEEDING BACKYARD BIRDS

Q: HOW DO I KEEP THE BIRDS COMING TO MY YARD?

You have your favourite places to eat, whether it's a quick bite or a really nice meal. You trust and rely on them, never considering they might run out of food. Birds are similar. They constantly check their food sources. They may stay and eat a while, grab a quick bite or not eat at all. But, they want to know they can rely on that food source when weather is good or bad or when times are abundant or lean. As much as you enjoy feeding the birds, it's a challenge to tend to the feeders every day. So, it's important to have at least one feeder that does not have to be filled very often. Of course, the birds will return after you refill an empty feeder, but it might take a few days. No matter how many bird feeders you have in your yard, it's important to have one that is the foundation of them all. This foundational feeder should be one that is able to accommodate many birds at one time, such as hopper, tube or cylinder feeders. It should have a quality food that attracts the widest variety of birds like No-Mess Blend or Cylinder foods. It should hold enough food for at least 4 days giving birds a reliable food source, ensuring you'll have more birds to watch! Be sure to place your foundational feeder where it's easy to fill and easy to see. Having a foundational feeder in your yard that never goes empty is key to being the birds' favourite restaurant and keep them coming year-round; bringing you more joy!

Q: WHEN SHOULD I PUT MY HUMMINGBIRD FEEDER OUT?


The hummers have already started migrating, crossing the Caribbean and heading up through the southern states on their way to western Canada. We can expect to see returning Ruby-throated Hummingbirds by mid-May. It's a good idea to get your feeders filled and ready to put out shortly after May 5 or as soon as possible after that date. The reason to put them out this early is so that the males, who usually arrive before the females, will see your feeder as they begin passing through looking for territories with good food supplies. Most hummingbirds recognize feeders as sources of food as they have either been shown them by their mothers, or have used them on their journey south on migration. It's good to use a feeder that is easy to fill and clean, and one that allows you to see the bird regardless of where it is on the feeder. The nectar they need is easy to prepare, 1 part granulated white sugar mixed with 4 parts warm water, to help it dissolve. Don't put coloured dye in the solution as it's unknown how different dyes affect the health of the hummers, and brightly coloured feeders are designed to attract them anyway. Keep some in the fridge to make it easy to refill the feeder.

Q: CAN I ATTRACT BLUEBIRDS TO MY YARD?

Although Mountain Bluebirds are common in Alberta, unless you live in the countryside it's unlikely you will be able to attract them to your yard. They breed in prairie landscapes and parkland areas, such as those surrounding Edmonton. They will nest in cavities in trees but they are most often seen using bluebird boxes attached to fence posts in rural areas with open fields and trees along the fence lines. If you have suitable land around you, you could consider putting up a few bluebird boxes, especially if your yard is next to open spaces. They begin to arrive in our area in March. The first recorded sighting this year was on March 11th just south-east of Edmonton, perhaps the earliest sighting ever of a Mountain Bluebird in our area. Bluebirds are members of the thrush family. Like Robins (also a thrush), they eat insects and sometimes fruit if snow and cold make insects unavailable. The good news is that you can still see bluebirds by driving along range and township roads from April to July. In the fall they migrate as far south as Mexico. Contact us if you'd like us to send you a map of where to go in Parkland County to find Mountain Bluebirds.



COMMUNITY HALL MOSAIC

If you are a regular visitor to our community centre, you may have noticed some significant changes to the grounds and building over the years.

Several years ago, the revitalization committee started the ball rolling with a new playground, landscaping, and parking areas. This was followed by new flooring and lighting, and the addition of windows, doors, and a covered patio area. Later in another volunteer initiative the kitchen was enlarged and upgraded, the skate change room received a facelift, a universal washroom was added to the foyer, and the existing washrooms were upgraded. Then just last year, the sound quality of the main hall was brought up to performance quality with the addition of sound baffles on the walls and stage curtains.

All of these changes and enhancements are keeping our centre beautiful, modern, and relevant to the variety of activities and programs that the league hosts on a regular basis.

So, what comes next? The facilities committee and board of directors has identified the lobby and front entrance as the next area in need of an upgrade. Included on the list of items to be addressed are a new suspended ceiling, lighting, flooring, and most importantly the beautiful but aging mosaic that covers half of the east wall of the foyer.

The mosaic is a fixed feature art piece created when the centre was built in the mid 1970's. Composed of glass, tile and stone, the mosaic depicts a lively and colourful scene of musicians and dancers. The mosaic was designed by a local artist; materials were donated by a business in the city. Other than that, the history of the mosaic – how it came to be and who actually did the work – remains a mystery.

The mosaic is an eye catcher and conversation piece. It identifies Parkview community and the centre as a friendly and festive meeting place, and impresses our many visitors. After thirty plus years, the mosaic has an increasing historic and artistic value but sadly, it is steadily deteriorating and in dire need of restoration. Many of the tiles have now fallen off and disappeared leaving empty patches of cloth mesh backing exposed. Preliminary consultation with arts people have brought up questions and speculation as to the mosaics history, whether the mosaic can be restored and/or otherwise preserved, the cost involved.


