PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Thank you for responding to our call for support. Last summer, I referred to the fact that people don't volunteer because they are never asked, so we asked. In October, more than eighty community league members participated in our Annual General Meeting (and holding AGMs isn't even the most fun thing we do in a year!) It was an important demonstration of community engagement and a wonderful reminder of why we live and feel a part of this neighbourhood called Parkview.

Councilor Knack brought greetings from City Council and provided opening remarks and helpful guidance to the Parkview Traffic Safety Committee, who is currently seeking Vision Zero remedies to neighbourhood speeding and moving violations – particularly around our community schools and public spaces. Councilor Knack introduced Daniel Vriend, Urban Transportation, and Carla Stolte, Public Engagement Advisor. Mr. Vriend and Ms. Stolte provided historical context for traffic safety issues in Parkview, offered strategies and potential remedies, and discussed how City Administration prioritizes neighbourhood-readiness when implementing traffic calming measures.

The audience asked educated and insightful questions and past board members provided invaluable documentation about the last time a traffic safety strategy was proposed to Edmonton City Council over ten years ago. The discussion concluded with a general consensus emerging in favour of "neighbourhood speed limits" (e.g., 30km/h). However, this remedy will depend heavily on the results of the Municipal Government Act (MGA) Review being conducted by the Province.

Perhaps the most important result of the AGM was the election of a new board of directors including:

THE SNOW ANGEL PHILOSOPHY

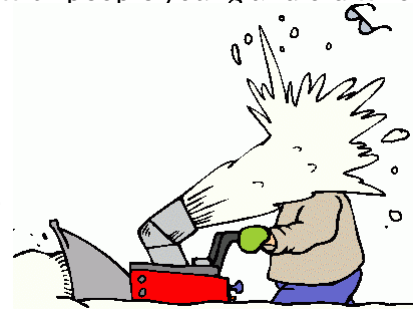
DOING *MY* PART FOR *OUR* COMMUNITY



Edmonton is a winter city that sees significant snowfall. The snow and ice that accumulates on sidewalks during the winter season is hazardous for everyone.

People with limited mobility, older persons, children, parents with strollers – even those with no obvious limitations – may be severely injured from a fall on ice or snow. Uncleared walkways can also make it difficult for those who deliver services in our city (e.g., mail carriers, meter readers, delivery drivers, emergency personnel) to do their jobs, safely. In fact, each year, ERs and clinics are filled with people young and old who have slipped and fallen on unmaintained sidewalks.

For these reasons, Community Standards Bylaw 14600 requires homeowners and tenants in a home to clear snow and ice from every walk and driveway on or beside their property, as well as from any other properties they own, including derelict and vacant buildings. Owners and tenants should use sand or ice-melting products to start the clearing process if they cannot shovel immediately after a snowfall. The fine for failing to clear sidewalks within 48 hours of the last snowfall is \$100.



This winter, all Parkview residents who shovel on a regular basis as well as those who help neighbours in need will receive a City of Edmonton “Snow Angels” lawn sign from the Parkview Community League. Snow Angels will also be eligible for a prize-pack from Boston Pizza and 1 of 10 pairs of Oil King tickets.

Become a Snow Angel by:



- Shoveling your walk within 48 hours of a snowfall;
- Shoveling a neighbor's walk;
- Starting a conversation with neighbours about the importance of clear sidewalks; and
- Making a plan with your neighbours to share the shoveling.



Let's work together to keep our sidewalks clear! Proper snow management by the City and its citizens makes Edmonton a more livable and loveable winter city.

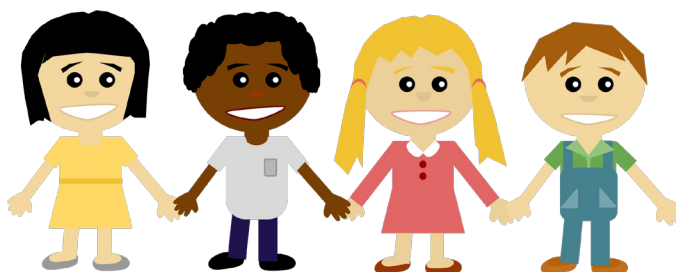

COMMUNITY SANDBOXES

Last year, when the City was looking for efficiencies to reduce costs, the Community Sandboxes program was identified as a potential reduction. This decision was approved as part of the budget process in 2015 (see page 27), and will save approximately \$300,000 in taxpayer dollars annually.

Instead of offering free sand for the public at community halls across the city, sand will now be provided at the five Roadway Maintenance yards:



- **Northwest: 14320-114 Avenue***
- Central: 10517-95 Street
- Northeast: 13003-56 Street
- Southeast: 5409-59 Avenue
- Southwest: 14710 Ellerslie Road (next to the Eco Station)



However, for the convenience of its residents, Parkview Community League has submitted a request to the City of Edmonton to receive a box (with City of Edmonton identification removed) that will be filled and maintained at the community's expense. As usual, it will be located near the northwest corner of the main parking lot.

**Until the request to the City of Edmonton is fulfilled, the Northwest Roadway Maintenance yard is the closest location for Parkview residents to get sand.*

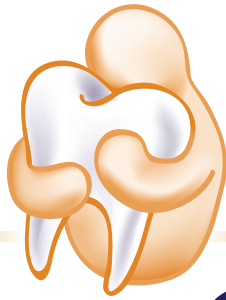

QUESTIONS ABOUT FEEDING WILD BIRDS

Q: HOW CAN I MAKE MY YARD MORE BIRD-FRIENDLY?

Providing trees, shrubs, flowers, and offering your birds food and water are all key components of a bird-friendly yard. You can get additional guidance from the Canadian Wildlife Federation (CWF), who have a program to certify your property as wildlife-friendly provided that specific criteria and established best practices are met. Once your yard is certified you can get an official sign to place in your garden. With certification you gain official status and personal satisfaction in being part of a community of Canadians that are helping local and migratory wildlife, including species at risk, right in your own backyard. There are at least two properties in our area that we know of that are certified, one of which is owned by Parkview resident Rachael Deitch, a customer of ours whom we helped with the application process. Certified properties can raise awareness in their communities of the importance of gardening with wildlife in mind and that it can be done beautifully, in any gardening style you like, and in any size of yard. The CWF certification program mirrors nature by including the needs of songbirds and pollinators as well as other beneficial wild neighbours. The program also recognizes the benefits of providing artificial nesting and feeding structures, but they are also looking for a rounded approach that includes natural features which supports a diversity of wildlife. Some of you may already have backyards or properties close to or ready for certification. The photo accompanying this article is from Rachael Deitch's certified wildlife-friendly property in the city of Edmonton. Q: WHY DO WOODPECKER NOT FALL OFF THE TREE WHEN THEY ARE PECKING?

When you take a close look at the birds in your yard, you'll see behaviours or things about them you haven't noticed before. This is one of the fun things about observing wildlife in your yard. This question about the woodpecker is a good case in point. When you have heavy work to do, it's good to have a three point stance, and that's what a woodpecker has. Their long toes and unique tail make all the difference. Essentially, the woodpecker's tail is just like a kickstand on a bike, which keeps it from falling over. If you observe a woodpecker as it lands, you will notice that it uses its long tail feathers to prop itself up against the tree preventing it from falling off. The strong and stiff feathers absorb the force of the woodpecker's hammering blows and help to firmly anchor it to the tree. Closer observation will also reveal that each of these unique feathers is tipped with a pointed spike. Similar in shape and function to a power pole worker's climbing spikes, the woodpecker digs them into the tree's bark as it climbs. We would love to hear your observations of birds. Keep an eye out for new discoveries in your back yard.

Q: HOW DO I KEEP SQUIRRELS FROM EATING FROM MY BIRD FEEDER?

In the fall squirrels are constantly looking for ways to get food to store for the winter months. In addition to things like nuts and mushrooms, squirrels are quite happy to visit your feeders to collect and store the food you offer your birds. If you are having problems with squirrels eating too much of your bird food, there are a number of things you can do. The first is to set up your feeders so there is a physical barrier preventing them from getting onto your feeders. This can be done by putting your feeder on a pole they can't climb or that has a baffle on it that physically blocks them. If the feeder is under a tree or there is a way they can get on from above, we have plastic domes that are too slippery for squirrels. There are tube feeders that have a spring loaded cover that closes over the feeding ports of the feeder when the squirrel, which is heavier than most birds, climbs onto the feeder. These made in Canada feeders are the most reliable for fending off squirrels. A new product that we carry is a suet cylinder that includes cayenne pepper mixed into the suet. This works because squirrels, like other mammals, have many taste buds and they don't like the hot pepper in the blend. Birds, unlike mammals, have very few taste buds and the cayenne pepper does not bother them. Many people enjoy the squirrels in their back yard, but if they get a bit out of hand, you can try some of these methods to prevent access to your bird feeders.

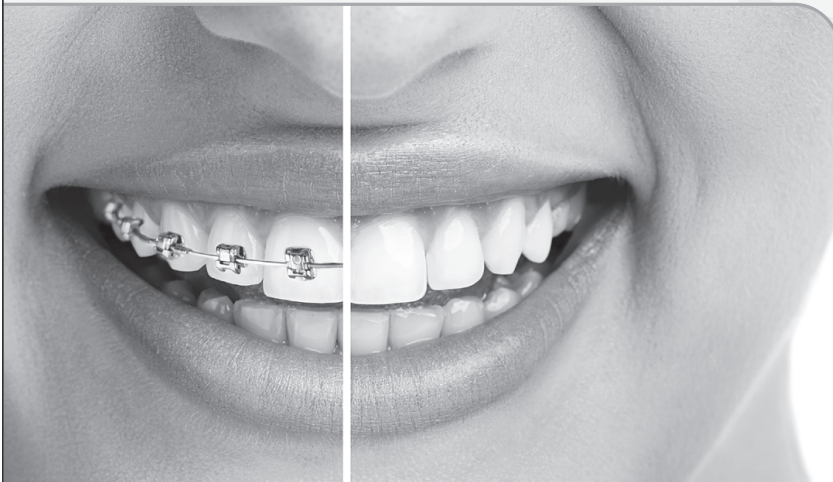

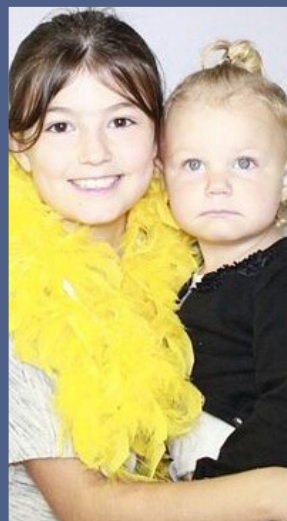

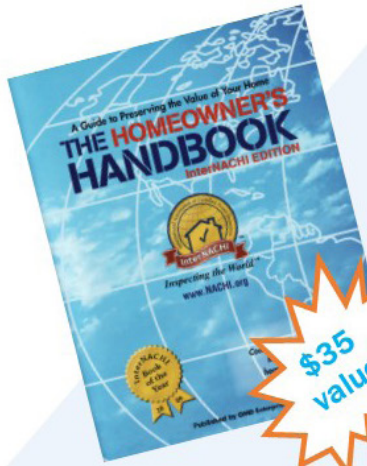
