EPSB Sector Planning Review 2010

Earlier this year the Edmonton Public School Board (EPSB) launched a review to assess the viability of a number of schools in communities across Edmonton. Parkview School, together with neighbouring public schools (Crestwood and Laurier Heights among others), are being assessed as part of the review of West 1 Sector schools to determine whether they will stay open, close or be consolidated/reorganized in some way.

Schools in mature neighbourhoods typically have more space than students and, as such, are considered to be operating below capacity. This under-utilization places a burden on the school and school board when it comes to operating costs (e.g., utilities, maintenance of aging infrastructure) and funding. In other words, not enough students are enrolled to make it financially feasible to offer programs and hire additional staff.

Parkview School

According to the EPSB's viability statistics, Parkview School does not meet the school board's requirements for the number of Elementary students. Parkview School does exceed the requirements for its Junior High enrolment. However, a historical decline in the school's enrolment over the past five years and the fact that there are five public schools within a 1.6 km radius of Parkview make the possibility of some kind of change at Parkview and its neighbouring schools likely.

President's Message cont'd



Why is this review important to all Parkview residents?

The closure of a neighbourhood school affects the entire community. The loss of a school can set a community on a negative path, prompting

some families to leave while also making it less attractive for families with school-aged children to move in. This results in a further drop in the school-aged population, which leads to more school closures and the cycle repeats itself.

When a school is closed, a key building block integral to the community is lost. If this were to happen to Parkview School, what the building and land would be used for is uncertain.

So rather than face a school closure, we can encourage the EPSB to consider the interconnectedness of nearby local schools and work to find ways to make these local community schools and programs complementary. We don't need to see this as a NIMBY issue but rather as an opportunity to work with our neighbouring communities to ensure our schools remain viable and open.

One way is to encourage the EPSB is to work with local organizations to see if there are other ways of using the excess capacity at a school. For example, the City of Edmonton has a long list of non-profit agencies looking for space including arts groups, cultural groups, social and recreational organizations. Also, Parkview and Crestwood are underserved with a lack of Out-of-School-Care programs in the area. Encourage the EPSB to invite an OSC provider into the schools (like at Laurier Heights).

All of us living in Parkview know it as a wonderful, vibrant, engaged community. Keeping our local school open helps our community stay vibrant and thriving. Please take the time to support our school and our community by making your voice heard.

Join the discussion and express your opinion (http://www.connect2edmonton.ca/forum/forumdisplay.php?f=77).

5. Contact the Ward C school trustee, Sue Huff, to learn her views on how the review affects Parkview and its neighbouring communities and offer your suggestions. Contact Sue at (780) 429-8087 or by email Sue.Huff@epsb.ca

6. Keep the municipal election in October in mind. Find out school trustee candidates' positions on school closures/consolidations and vote for the candidate whose views best reflect your own.

7. The provincial government controls education funding. Contact the MLA for Parkview, Kevin Taft, and the Minister of Education, Honourable Dave Hancock and let them know that a school is the hub of a vibrant community. Ask them for their support in keeping community schools open.

Parkview Redevelopment Society Phase III - Construction Revving Up Again

Construction on Phase III began in June to reclaim the old parking lot and create a new social space. Some decisions are being made along way as a result of design and architectural issues relating to the structure of our community league building.

The Parkview Redevelopment Society (PRS), in conjunction with the Parkview Community League, are addressing design, architectural and financial issues as needed; construction is expected to continue into early fall.

The PRS submitted a Community Facilities Enhancement Program (CFEP) grant application through the provincial government earlier this year. The committee recently received notice that the request has been denied. Despite this financial setback, PRS will use all of its reserve funding and grant monies from the City of Edmonton to push the project through to completion.

We plan to again invite the residents of Parkview to join us for a **"Party in the Park" Grand Opening and Recognition Event** to celebrate the completion of the park revitalization project. Stay tuned for details.


Now is the time....



(Ages 5-7) This joyful introduction to drama is designed to build confidence and self-awareness, nurturing each child's unique ability to express ideas. Storybooks, music, rhymes and special themes, will be used to inspire creative and interpretive movement, literacy, role-play, choral speech, singing, imaginary journeys, and story building.

Friends with Tales

(Ages 8-9) This group will explore literature-based themes and express ideas through creative movement, choral speech, dance drama, and acting. They will create and enact stories, adopt roles, and explore different courses of action that characters can take. Dramatization with puppetry, masks and mime will also be developed.

Myths, Legends and Twisted Tales

(Ages 10-11) Participants will build confidence and self-esteem by expressing themselves through drama and by putting themselves into the conflicts, actions and emotions of a variety of characters and situations. Explore creative drama, improvisation, scripts and storytelling in a collaborative and encouraging atmosphere. Participants can choose to perform for others or just for themselves, based on group consensus.

he Parkview Playschool is a nonprofit, parent cooperative school that is located on the 2nd floor of the Parkview Community League. We have 3 different classes for the upcoming school year. We have a 3-year-old class on Tues-



day and Thursday mornings, a 4-year-old class on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings, and a 3/4 blend class on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons. The afternoon blend class has the 3 year olds attending Monday and Wednesdays and the 4 year olds attending all three afternoons. We currently have spots available in our afternoon class for 3 and 4 year olds for the 2010-2011 school year. Parkview Playschool is directed by a volunteer executive and is a subgroup of the Parkview Community League. As a non-profit parent cooperative, all parents are required to volunteer for in-class roster duty approximately every 12 to 16 classes, one toy wash per year and one fund-raising activity. As well, parents are asked to contribute or donate occasional supplies, assist with fieldtrips, special events and the option to participate on the executive board.

Our teacher, Merri-Ann Wojcicki achieves the goals of the Parkview Playschool through classroom activities, such as:



-Free play - allowing children to create, explore, share, problem-solve, play cooperatively, etc -Calendar, weather, etc -Story time, sing-a-long and action songs, etc -Exercise, games and gym-time -Music and stories on tape and rhythm instruments

-Crafts, painting, colouring, cutting, creating

- -"Show and Share" and "Busy Bee" responsibilities
- -Class parties on special days throughout the year
- -Field trips, special events and invited visitors
- -School readiness skills

Pumpkin Pie Recipe

"Here is a simple, uncomplicated melding of canned pumpkin with sugar, cinnamon, eggs and milk, baked in the crust of your choice. A dollop of whipped cream is all the frou-frou you need."

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup white sugar

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

2 eggs

- 1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree
- 1 1/4 cups milk
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- In a large mixing bowl, stir together white sugar, brown sugar, salt, and cinnamon. When these ingredients are well mixed, stir in the eggs followed by the pumpkin and milk. Transfer mixture to the pie crust.
- **3.** Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 1/2 hours, or until a toothpick inserted into the pie comes out clean. Cool before serving.
