Parkview Community League is hosting a Casino on <u>April</u> 7 and 8, 2011 at The Palace Casino, West Edmonton Mall.


Casino Organizer, Brenda McDonald, needs volunteers for a few shifts on each day for various positions.

Jasper Place Library Branch is Moving!

New Branch will open Fall 2012...

Twenty-one years after its last renovation, design work to replace the Jasper Place Branch is now underway. The expanded library will be re-built on its existing location and will have an additional 4,000 square feet (to 15,000 square feet) along with an expanded program room, quiet study space, an outdoor public terrace, dedicated childrens and teen areas, and additional parking.

Construction Schedule and Temporary Location

Construction is slated to begin in Spring 2011 with expected completion for the new branch in Fall 2012. The branch will be closed beginning February 13, 2011 for approximately 18 months. During this time a temporary library will be located at 9509 156 Street (third floor) inside the West End Medical & Professional Building.

The temporary location will open on Monday, February 28 offering the following limited services and resources:

* Hold pick-ups

* Material returns (after-hours book drop will not be available)

* High demand materials including: CDs, DVDs, video games, best-sellers to go, paperbacks, magazines, newspapers

* Limited public computers with Internet access

* Unlimited Wi-Fi





Candy Cane Lane officially turned 33 years old last year(2010). Even though there have been several changes it remains much the same as it was in the beginning. It has grown from just a few Crestwood homes participating in the 1960's to the 8 blocks of 148 Street, between 100



Ave and into Parkview at 92 Ave, but it has not lost its appeal. The citizens of Edmonton still consider it a must do during the Christmas season.

The 2010 edition started with a volunteer drive to help some of the residents put up their displays. About 30 volunteers came out, going door to door, asking residents if they would like help. The Crestwood Community League kicked in \$2000.00 to purchase some energy efficient LED light strings and donated them to residents that needed a little extra touch. Shaw Communications stepped up and donated the use of 8 cherry picker trucks and crews to assist with putting up lights in some of the bigger trees. Other donations of lights from Edmonton residents were gratefully received and used. Horse drawn sleigh rides were booked to capacity with over 300 riders a night on the two weekends before Christmas and although it was quite cold some of those nights, there was no need for any weather related cancellations through the season.

Social Media played an important role this year to organize volunteers and with twitter and Facebook as well as an updated web site, participation appears to be up from previous years. The 19,200 kilos of food donated to the Food Bank in 2010 is an increase of 7000 kilos from 2009, and may be a good indication that the declining years of this event are behind us. A big kudos goes out to the residents who continue to support Candy Cane Lane, to the many volunteers and of course the City of Edmonton who continue to recognize the importance of preserving this great Edmonton tradition.


