



Valerie Bright's community spirit an inspiring gift

It was a beautiful day. The trees were dressed in hoar frost, which is always a stunning show. Sunshine warmed the air and snowflakes danced like fairy dust. As I drove down the tree canopied street, the sky delivered a shade of blue I could not describe and I marveled at the beauty of the day.

If this day belied the cloud that had been looming over Parkview, it signified the time of Valerie Bright's release from her pain and suffering.



For the current generation of residents, Valerie was the beacon of community spirit in Parkview. She was a long-time volunteer serving our community in a lengthy list of roles that spanned Tot-time and playschool, to key roles related to the community revitalization project and hall improvements, and everything in between. With each responsibility, she employed her enthusiasm and her gift for seeing a new way of doing things. For her projects and fundraising efforts, she worked harder than anyone. No job was too menial or insurmountable, and she never asked of anyone what she wouldn't do herself.

She was also known for her generous hospitality, typically coming to a meeting with snacks to share or coffee from Second Cup, or hosting a gathering in her home for volunteers who served alongside her.

These were Val's ways of nurturing the community values that make us never want to move away from the neighbourhood. Val understood the importance of building relationships within the community and worked

to ensure there were ample opportunities to do just that. Val believed it was not enough to simply live here, but instead to be an integral thread in the fabric of our community. Being involved can truly redefine your big city experience. Instead of sea of strangers, it helps to know there are many who will look out for children, help in our time of need, or simply be there for our comfort.

When Val's illness gripped her health all too quickly, the community rallied behind the Bright family – our response to someone who touched many of us. It was our turn to give back. What we can continue to give back today is to, like Val, fully embrace the kinship of our community as it is an investment with immeasurable returns. Use the facilities that she was so dedicated to improving as that was her dream. In whatever community we choose to be involved, let us stretch out our own hands to share with others for it makes them feel valued. Let's share our wealth of time, talent or means. Val said she felt privileged to be able to give back, and so should we.



Drop in any Tuesday morning. We look forward to seeing you!




