Alberta Government Grant Awards \$500,000 to Parkview

he park redevelopment project will receive \$500,000 - the full amount requested through the Municipal Community Facility Program, which is funded by Alberta Lottery Fund.


"We have been awaiting this news from the Alberta government for a very long time and are absolutely ecstatic," exclaims Nancy Davis, committee chair. "Diligence and hard work have been rewarded and 2008 is off to a very exciting start."

Nancy added, the new year already started out strong with an extra boost of \$30,000. The committee received confirmation in December that its Ronald McDonald House grant application was successful and the project will be awarded \$25,000. As well, our gracious neighbours-the Chinese Alliance Church-made a \$5,000 donation after a stellar turnout during the installation weekend. Our thanks go to the church and its members for their support.

"We look ahead to the coming months with renewed energy,"

says treasurer Val Bright. The grants combined with roughly \$230,000 in unspent funds from the first phase of the

project mean the committee will be able to focus efforts on the proposed projects in Phase II. doors at the hall's front entry. The next stage will involve many decisions related to planning, costing and evaluating the various project components. The Alberta economy is expected to remain strong and will likely affect costs. Committee members, however, remain optimistic that the project scope will not be compromised.

President's Message

ity Hall made a decision that had a big 'impact on Parkview when they decided to abandon the planned Bus Rapid Transit program. The socalled BRT was scheduled to travel on 142nd Street between the traffic circle and Stony Plain Road, right through the heart of Parkview. You may remember that the plan had all but been given the goahead, when it was decided to shift resources to the LRT instead.

With a new emphasis on the LRT, Parkview will also be in the middle of that issue. As discussed previously in these pages, the West LRT route might - and I have to stress the word "might" - slice through Parkview. The city is currently looking at two routes that would get the LRT from West Edmonton Mall, along 87th Avenue, and over to the south side. The first proposal uses the freeway and Fox Drive, and would not affect Parkview.

But the other proposal takes the LRT right through Parkview, in a straight line across a new bridge to University Avenue. If the city selects this route we have to be careful to maintain a positive and cooperative approach. Simply shouting "NIMBY, NIMBY!!" (Not In My Back Yard) will not cut any ice, as our friends to the North learned when they opposed the Glenora Towers for no particular reason other than they did not want the project built near them.

There are a number of steps the city could take to reduce the impact of the LRT on Parkview. Instead of cutting a giant gash through the community the city could tunnel under the homes that lie in the path, with a tunnel beginning at the traffic circle and exiting somewhere along the river

bank. This would be a good thing for the city, too, as it would shorten the length of the bridge needed to get across the river. The point, I


point, I suppose, is that if we do wind up with the LRT routed

through Parkview we have two choices. We can, as a community, stand with our arms crossed in an all-ornothing battle to stop the LRT; a battle that will fail because of the city-wide importance of this project. Or we can be positive and work with the city to mitigate the effects. We will know more on February 11th, which is when the engineers hired by the city will unveil the route they will be recommending.

Five years is a big piece of a person's lifetime, but that's how long I have been

President of the Parkview Community League. It's been wonderful. During those five years the attitude of your executive has never been anything but positive. We are financially solvent, we provide a wide range of programs to the community, and we have volunteers that have a solid record of accomplishment and service to the community. I wish I could take the credit. But it's still a long time, and so I have reached the decision to step down as President. I want to thank everyone who has done so much, and made me look so good. I have no doubt Parkview will do just fine.
