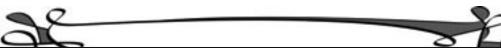

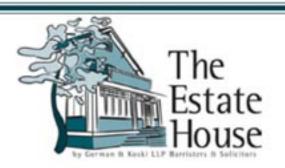

ast month I met with our Community Liaison EPS member and outlined some of the concerns of Parkview residents, including traffic issues and petty crimes.

The Edmonton Police Service has developed a crime mapping application for the public to view crime in neighbourhoods across the city. Neighbourhood crime is more than just numbers; it's about knowing where crime is happening in the area you live. Knowing the real picture of neighborhoods crime is the first step in doing something about it.

By accessing this timely information on reported crime, we will be able to know what is happening in our neighbourhood. By knowing what is going on, we can work together to reduce and prevent crime. To find out more log onto www.edmontonpolice.ca

Making a difference in Parkview

We need to act on this knowledge and create solutions. We begin to make a difference by knowing what's really going on in our neighborhoods. Please report any suspicious persons/behavior to **780-423-4567**. Examples of things to report are:

- Thefts/Mischiefs
- Break and Enters into homes/businesses
- Disturbances/Noise complaints
- Property damage collisions where vehicles are not driveable
- Parking Offences/abandoned autos
- Neighbour/Family disputes
- Suspicious persons/vehicles



Traffic Concerns....SLOW DOWN!

We as a community need to slow down and respect all traffic signals. Edmonton Police were out in our community conducting traffic enforcement in different sections in our

neighbourhood and did issue several tickets to local residents. We need to set an example to our neighbours and visitors on how we want people to drive on our roads.

- Take oversized garbage like tree cuttings or furniture to the eco-station or the dump.

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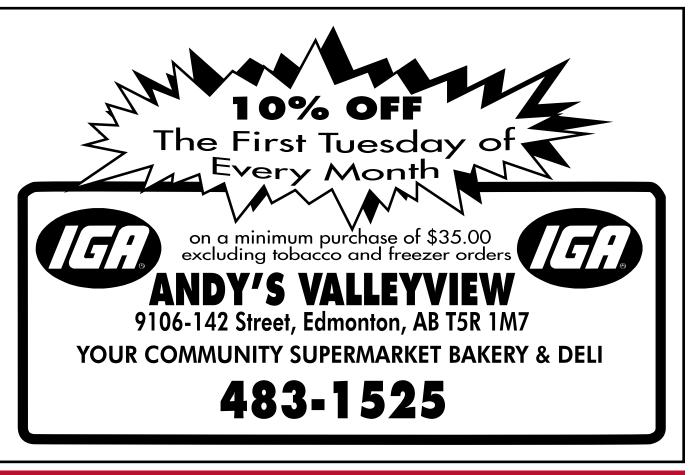

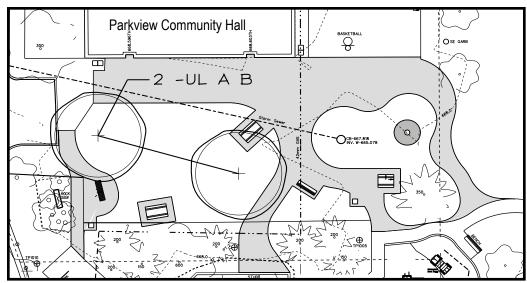

he Parkview Redevelopment Society (PRS) is pleased to report that Phase III plans are moving forward after several delays.

After meeting with our City of Edmonton project manager, the project is now going to tender. A contractor should be secured within the next few weeks, at which point the start date will be confirmed. The work itself is expected to take two to three weeks.

To provide a snapshot of the design (See Pict 1 above), this construction drawing shows plans for redeveloping the old parking lot area. The grey areas indicate new concrete extending from the hall and connecting to the park on the east and west sides. The white areas will be grass. The plans

also show the placement of a new fire pit area, additional benches and picnic tables, as well as two new trees.

Costs for the work are currently estimated at just over \$150, 000. Funding for the project will mainly come from a City of Edmonton Neighbourhood Parks Development Program (NPDP) grant, although the PRS has applied for \$125,000 from the Alberta government Community Facilities Enhancement Program, and if successful, will reserve the NPDP funding for project work at a later date.

The original project scope included a patio covering extending from the hall, as well as hall windows. Since the parking lot redevelopment will exhaust PRS funds, this

portion of the work will be left to the Parkview Community League.

In addition, the current committee will be stepping down once Phase III is complete. If you are interested in becoming involved, please contact any of the project directors listed on the sidebar in the left hand corner of this page.

We are confident the new social area will be a welcoming addition, where Parkview area residents will socialize with family and friends. Please make it part of your summer plans to enjoy the entire park and grounds.

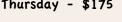

Thanks to all the coaching staffs for leading our teams. Several of the staffs have been coaching a similar group of players for years!! Community soccer can only exist because of you dedicated volunteers.

The soccer program in Parkview is in need of volunteers to assist in the coordinating of the program. A co-

coordinator to help with registrations, planning meetings and coordinating half of the teams would be ideal. The time commitment would be around 20 to 30 hours starting in January and lasting until the soccer season is over. The program could also use a person to take charge of the soccer equipment. would involve taking an inventory of the equipment we have and the distribution and collection of the team uniforms and other equipment. The time commitment would be around 10 to 20 hours from early April to mid July.

Finally, the indoor soccer coordinator from last season is unavailable. Parkview had 5 teams last season. The coordinating of indoor is substantially done by the West Zone Soccer Association so

the time commitment is less than for outdoor soccer. The season lasts from roughly October to March and somebody familiar with indoor soccer could easily handle this position.

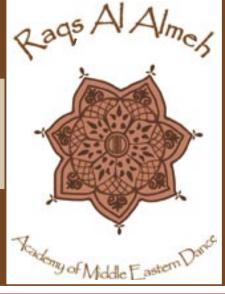

- **I. Honour bylaw rules** licence, leash, control and pick-up after your dog. Keep dogs 10 metres away from school grounds, playgrounds, sport fields and picnic sites.
- **2. Allow your dog off-leash** only within the boundaries of designated off-leash areas. The sites are all listed in this brochure!
- **3. Walk restricted dogs away from off-leash parks** they are not allowed in. These dogs must be leashed and muzzled at all times outside your property.
- 4. Limit aggressive dog behaviour
- immediately leash and check your dog if it acts hostile toward people, dogs or wildlife.
- **5. Train your dog** to respond to voice and signal commands.
- **6. Pick up after your dog** keep parks healthy and clean for everyone.
- 7. Protect your dog with vaccination
- stop the spread of infectious diseases to wildlife and other dogs.
- 8. Hold back dogs from chasing wildlife
- coyotes, deer, birds, waterfowl; all creatures great and small living in urban parks need our protection.
- **9.** Carry a leash on every walk restrain your dog where required, especially on trails, and use a leash no longer than 2 metres (six feet).

10. Be considerate and responsible

- keep your dog in sight, stay alert for other trail traffic, restrain your dog around other park or trail users and walk on the right.
- II. Share off-leash parks and trails with others all of Edmonton's parks and trails are multi-use; they belong to all of us!

where to walk dogs on-leash

Beyond your yard, keep your pet on a leash. Walk your dog on-leash along:

- any trail (more than 0.5m wide) on parkland;
- · city boulevards;
- or area signed on-leash.

keep dogs away from

- school grounds
- playgrounds
- sports fields
- picnic sites
- park buildings or facilities
- golf courses
- · off-trail outside off-leash area boundaries
- off-trail inside community league parks.

Just Doo It!

New bio-degradeable dog waste bags are available in off-leash parks. Place them in the Doolt! disposal containers for composting. Be a steward of Edmonton's great parks system. Properly removing dog waste is a safe, organic practice that will improve the health of the soil and the plants, resulting in less need for pesticide applications.

City residents will be able to drop off items such as old couches, chairs, mattresses, and appliances free of charge. Computers and other electronics will also be accepted for recycling.

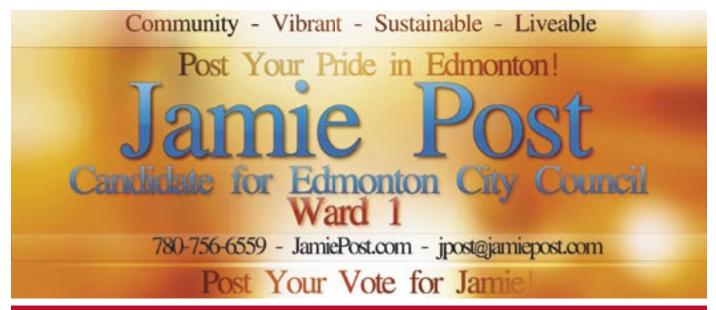

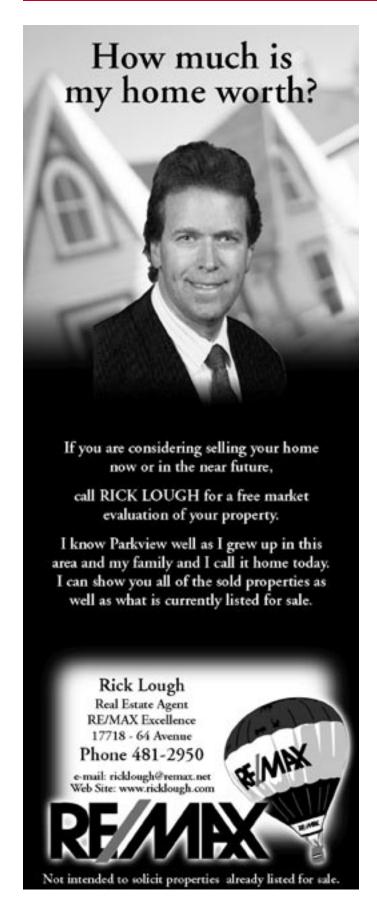

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Emergency

Window & Balcony Safety



With the return of warmer weather, Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents of an often overlooked hazard in the home – open windows. Every year, paramedics respond to emergencies where a child has fallen from an open window in their house- often from the second floor. Falls such as these are preventable by taking time to assess your home and ensuring windows are safe.

Windows and screens

- Move furniture such as cribs. beds, stools, and change tables away from windows to prevent access to them.
- Keep drapery cords out of childrens' reach. Wrap excess cord around cleats or tie-downs to avoid a choking hazard.
- Remember: screens are designed to keep bugs out, NOT to keep children in!

Balconies

- Do not underestimate a child's ability to climb. Furniture and other items stored on balconies and decks can be used to climb resulting in falls over the railing.
- Consider installing a balcony guard to eliminate access between the vertical bars of a balcony or deck.

Further prevention tips

- Children aged one to four are at highest risk of falling from a window or balcony.
- Direct supervision of children is the single most effective way to prevent falls from windows and balconies.
- Consider installing safety devices which limit windows opening to a maximum of 4 inches or 10 centimeters.
- Ensure the safety device can be released quickly so the window can be used for escape in case of fire or other emergency.

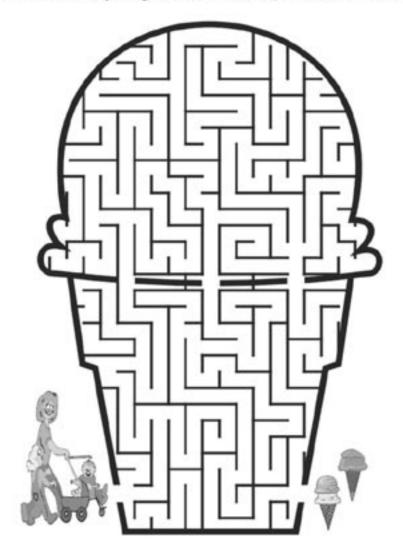

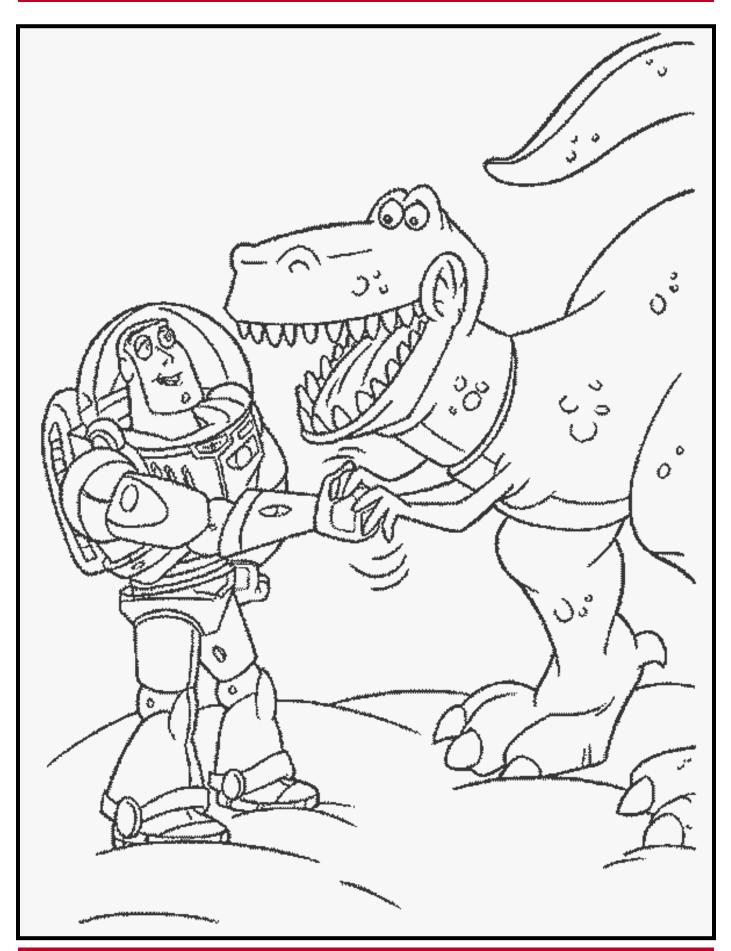


Strawberry Yogurt Popsicles Ingredients:
