

Latest Round of Renovations at Parkview Hall Cont'd

the PVCL Board, has overseen the following renovations:

Stage

The tattered old plywood facade has been re-faced with a durable, no-maintenance laminate that compliments the overall color scheme of the hall. The stage cubby doors and table trollies have been redesigned and re-enforced to better withstand the day-to-day wear and tear they receive. Beneath the stage, derelict ductwork has been reconnected to the building's heating system.

New Locks

A new keyless lock system is currently being implemented on the exterior doors to provide enhanced safety and convenience. Authorized community members as well as renters can be assigned temporary access codes to gain entry to the building instead of having to be given a key. Access codes will be monitored and/or terminated using a computer software program.

New Barrier-Free Washroom

A brand new, barrier-free, washroom, conveniently located off the front foyer has been added. Persons requiring wheelchairs will now have access to washroom facilities, and groups using the conference room and/or playschool will no longer have to traipse through the hall to use a washroom.

More storage

A storage room, constructed adjacent to the kitchen, and accessible from the hall, has been built to store the hall's round tables, rolling bar, and a full-size fridge. The plan is that this room may also double as a bar area when the round tables are in use.

New Warming Kitchen

The kitchen has been totally renovated and made larger. The redesigned kitchen boasts all new cabinets and appliances including two gas ranges with warming drawers, three sinks, a stand-up freezer, refrigerator, and a commercial dishwasher generously



donated by Wendy and David Wilks (owners of On The Rocks and

the Druid). The existing standup cooler, which was deemed to be in good working order, has also been incorporated into the new design, along with a pantry for storage of larger items. Two custom stainless steel islands and plenty of open shelving have been designed to accommodate the temporary storage of food trays, containers, boxes, dishes, etc...all the paraphernalia involved with catering an event.

Behind the new kitchen, is a mop room complete with mop sink and washer/dryer unit. The garage, although slightly smaller, can still accommodate two snow blowers along with the various tools and supplies need to maintain the hall.

Bird Feeding Tips

By Dave Cleary

The average Edmonton backyard may be visited regularly by 15 to 20 different bird species through the year. Providing an easy-to-find source of food not only gives birds nourishment, but it also gives them more time to find mates, build nests, raise their young and other activities that are key to their survival. Here are some things you can do to make your backyard a refuge for yourself and your birds.

Food

Attracting a variety of birds requires a variety of foods. A lot of bird seed sold in grocery, hardware, and other stores contain fillers such as oats, wheat, barley, and milo - seeds the majority of feeder birds don't eat. Buy quality bird seed to reduce the waste and provide food your birds are really looking for.

Water

Birds need water just as much as they need food. Their high metabolic rate and respiratory system drains moisture from their bodies quickly. However, birds use water for more than just a thirst quencher; they also use it for bathing and preening their feathers. Clean feathers are important for birds' health and optimum flying ability.

Cover

Birds need protective cover for times of rest, social interaction and as a retreat from foul weather and predators. Plants that are native to our soil and climate provide the best overall food sources for wildlife and support from 10 to 50 times more native wildlife than exotic (or non-native) plants.

A Place to Raise Their Young

The same plantings that provide shelter can provide safe areas for many bird species to mate, build nests and raise their families. But with the increased loss of natural habitat, cavitynesting birds lack appropriate sites to nest. By providing bird houses, you will encourage birds to raise their young in your backyard.

Backyard bird feeding is a great hobby the entire family can enjoy. It's a way to connect with nature, preserve green spaces, and help wildlife.





- 2) Inspect your humidifier and replace the evaporator pad if it contains any sediment. Clean the humidifier housing as required.
- **3)** Remove furnace panels and inspect for dust, carbon, rust and water damage. Vacuum as required. Re-install panels, turn furnace on and listen through a full heating cycle. If there are unusual noises or concerns, call for service or advice.
- **4)** Remove a cold air return register. If there is a buildup of dust, consider having the furnace and ducts professionally cleaned.
- **5)** Inspect your outside A/C condenser for dust, pollen and leaves clogging the cooling fins or cabinet. Vacuum and rinse as required. Turn A/C on and listen through a full cooling cycle. If there are unusual noises or concerns, call for service or advice.
