
We had a fantastic turnout with around 200 people dropping by and participating in the fun. The free event offered several activities for the family, as well hotdogs and treats for everyone.



and pathways, teenagers courting... It warms my heart to know that the efforts of the volunteer committee have been put to good use. Our humble ideas grew into big plans and a crazy adventure began."

Over the past seven years, countless volunteer hours have been spent surveying, planning, fundraising and managing the redevelopment of the Parkview community park. The first phases involved the installation of all-new playground equipment and paved pathways, as well as parking lot relocation and significant landscape enhancements. Phase III projects included the rehabilitation of the old parking lot, converting it into a social area that bridges the hall and patio with the playground. This new green space offers pathways, benches, grass and fire pit areas. All of these park renovations cost \$1.8 million.

We look forward to the installation of the natural gas fire pit, which will be ready for use in 2012. Special thanks to Valerie Bright, David Smith and Brian Mulder for volunteering their time and their wheelbarrows to prepare the site in advance of the installation.

Several other improvements were also completed in the past year, including a patio and awning with gas heaters, the installation of south-facing windows; as well as all new paint, flooring and lighting. The community league is planning still more renovations in the boardroom, kitchen, bathrooms and skate shack. Valerie Bright has enlisted a new team of volunteers to assist in the completion of these additional renos.

Two recognition plaques are now installed within the playground area. One plaque acknowledges the families who purchased park equipment and the second plaque pays tribute to Emma Richartz. In a touching moment, Nancy dedicated the swings to little Emma, who loved to swing there before passing away at the tender age of two. Emma's family and friends raised the money

to purchase the new swings and many of them came together to build and install the swing set during the playground installation in 2007. We know many children will also delight in the



Six cubic yards of soil and 340 square feet of sod later, the job looked pretty good. My thanks and great appreciation go to Val and Brian (and their sore backs) for sharing the heavy lifting on this. I'm doubling your Christmas bonus this year!



Safety Corner

afety and crime prevention is a lot of things you might not think of; it's more than just locks, alarms and keeping an eye open for suspicious characters. Each of us is involved in crime prevention activities in our daily lives. Reaching out to new neighbours, making them feel like they belong; mentoring children and youth or acting as good role models as community volunteers; coaching recreational sports teams; helping seniors living nearby by shoveling their walk or keeping their lawn mowed. All these activities contribute to making our community safe and healthy.

This safety corner will focus on safety tips for you, your family, property and our community.

Personal Safety

Protecting yourself is just as important as protecting your home or property. Here are a few things to remember:

- Pick safe routes to get to your destination.
- At night, take routes that are well lit and have other people in the area.
- If you're using transit, stand or ride near others do not isolate yourself.
- · Walk/run with others if possible.
- \bullet If you're carrying small personal electronics, like an iPod, conceal it under your clothes.

Property and Home Safety

Your home is the most valuable asset you have and it is worth protecting. Here are some tips to help you keep your home safe:

- If out of the house for an extended period of time, create the illusion that someone may still be home. Leave a TV or stereo on in the room where a burglar would most likely break in. Use exterior lighting and motion detectors to minimize burglar concealment.
- Make sure all exterior doors have good proper locks.
- If you get an unexpected knock at the door, check to see who it is before opening it.
- Do not leave extra keys under doormats, potted plants or any other obvious outdoor location. Thieves will generally find them. Find an inconspicuous place to hide the keys, or give a set to a neighbor you can trust
- Burglar-proof your glass patio doors by setting a pipe or metal bar in the middle bottom track of the door slide. The pipe should be the same length as the track
- Keep garage doors shut and automatic door openers out of site.
- Keep drapes and blinds shut especially in rooms where there is expensive equipment. Don't advertise the items in your home.

Community Safety

The most important way to keep Parkview safe is to WORK TOGETHER!

- Get to know your neighbors and their children so you can look out for one another.
- Watch out for suspicious and unusual behavior in our neighborhood and REPORT anything you think may be suspicious to the police complaint line
- even if you think it is petty, it is important... it will bring awareness to Police

so they can deal with the issues accordingly.

- Examples of things to report to the Police Complaint Line (780-423-4567)
 are:
- o Theft and/or Mischief
- o Break and Enters into homes/businesses/garages/vehicles
- o Disturbances/Noise complaints
- o Property damage collisions where vehicles are not driveable
- o Parking Offences/abandoned autos
- o Neighbour/Family disputes
- o Suspicious persons/vehicles
- o Suspicious folks wandering/scouting the neighbourhood

Holiday Crime Prevention Tips At Home

With Christmas just around the corner here are some tips to ensure you and your family have a safe and happy holiday.

- Keep the outside of your home well lit with doors locked and window curtains closed.
- Don't display gifts beneath the Christmas tree that can be seen from windows or doors.
- · After the holidays, don't advertise gifts received

by the boxes left for the garbage collection. Destroy boxes and place in a sealed, non-clear garbage bag.



Assisted Waste Collection

The City's Waste Management Branch offers an assisted waste collection service for customers who have difficulty getting their recycling or garbage to the curb or lane. Collectors will walk up pick up garbage and recycling from the outside of the front or back door of the home. There is no additional charge for this service.

Who is eligible?

This service is for Edmonton residents with temporary or permanent mobility challenges who do not have someone to take their waste to the curb or back lane for them. Assisted waste collection promotes independent living and reduces the risk for dangerous slips and falls caused by icy or wet conditions.

How can I apply?

Fill in the application form and mail it or fax it as directed on the form. Printable application forms can be found at www.edmonton. ca/waste. Applications can also be completed online at this website and submitted electronically.

How will my application be processed?

We will contact you by telephone within one week of receiving your application. The application process includes a home visit where customer service staff can help determine the best location for setting out your garbage and recycling, as well as set a start date for your service.

How long can I receive the service?


The service will be provided for a minimum of three months and for as long as you have the need. It is your responsibility to let us know if you no longer need the service by contacting the Waste Management Branch at (780) 496-5698.

What will the collector pick up?

The collector will pick up the same materials that are collected from all households and the same regulations will apply. Recycling must be in blue bags and garbage can be in a black bag or container.

Each container must be no larger than 100 liters. Each bag or can should weigh no more than 20 kg.




