President's Message

Things in Parkview are starting to settle into their normal fall and winter routine. Many of the community programs for these seasons are up and running smoothly, although we could use some extra help with the Parkview Executive.

Right now, there are at least six volunteer spaces open including Basketball Coordinator, Indoor Soccer Coordinator, Outdoor Soccer Coordinator, Adult Programs Coordinator, Special Events Coordinator and Traffic Liaison. If the leadership positions for these programs are not filled, they will be unavailable to community residents through Parkview; with basketball, for example, you'll need instead to go to other leagues or organizations to access the program. The bigger issue, however, is losing the momentum that has already gone into leading these programs; that momentum will be lost if users access these services elsewhere. So step up and volunteer for

your neighbourhood. These positions may not require as much time as you think, and we could use the help.



Another big item since the last newsletter was the wonderfully successful opening of the Parkview playground in late September. The day proved to be warm and sunny and we had hundreds out to enjoy the playground and additional events. There's talk of making this into something of an annual event (the day of fun that is, not the opening), given the popularity with community residents. If you think that's a good idea, call, come by or write in and let us know.

The other big item to note for Parkview is the rescheduling of the public hearing



for the alignment decisions on the West LRT. This was already deferred twice this past summer (initially to September 2008 and later to November). In October, we were copied on a letter from the city's transportation Manager, Bob Boutilier, requesting Council consider postponing these public hearings yet again to give his department even more time to finish examining other routes in West Edmonton (routes other than 87th Avenue). The request was approved and the new hearings are now set for June 2009.

Boutilier has asked the city for additional time to consider routes such as Stony Plain Road and "other northern routes" in addition to 87th Avenue. This is unquestionably good news for Parkview, especially for those residents who live on or near 87th

Avenue and were eyeing the city's proposed LRT alignment on the avenue with at least suspicion and at most dread.

But the fight to relocate the alignment to another east-west corridor is not yet won. We consider this a major step in having the city consider other, better, more sensible routes, but 87th Avenue may remain on the consideration list until other routes can show similar or better ridership projections. It's clear we may still need to put forward our case later to have the *whole run* of 87th Avenue removed from further consideration.

In the meantime, the city will look at new western routes designs that minimize the LRT on 87th (latest routes have it running on 87 only between 170th Street and 163rd Street) while maximizing the potential for transit-oriented development and sufficient ridership to warrant the \$1.5 billion costs. We'll keep you posted.

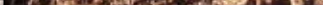

The committee will be back at the drawing board to set the direction for the third phase of work on the community league grounds. The Parkview Redevelopment Society will again be working with City of Edmonton planners to establish plans for redeveloping the old parking lot site. Discussions will move ahead in November. If you have any suggestions, we encourage you to contact a committee member.

The scope of Phase III is dependent on the availability of grants and donations from businesses and people like you. It is considered a new project requiring all new funding. As all money has been

spent on Phases I & II, new seed money is required for grant applications.

If you have donated to previous phases of the park revitalization, we encourage you to make an additional contribution. The cumulative sum of your donations will be recognized on the permanent recognition feature when the project is complete.

If you have not yet made your tax deductible donation to the project, we hope you like what you see and will support ongoing work with your donation today. All recognition thresholds remain the same, beginning at \$250.

- temporary physical changes (such as adding bike lanes).

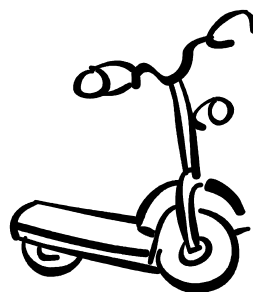

‘passenger’: using means of public transport such as bus, tram, subway, light rail, train, ferry; collective taxi, taxi (preferably with low-emission drives) and above vehicles with supporting electrical drive (preferably powered by renewable energy)

The application deadline is November 21st, 2008.

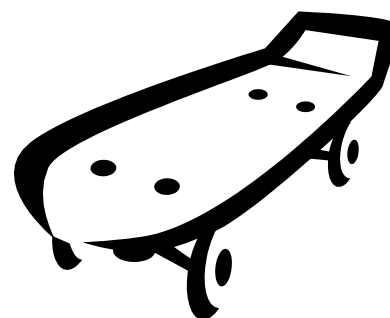
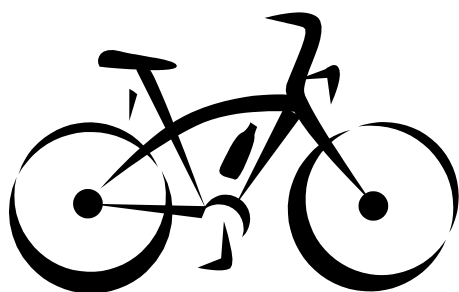

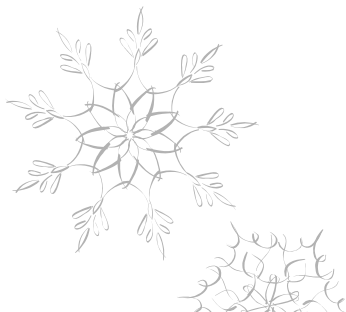
