A TRIBUTE TO ANDY'S IGA

I literally grew up in Andy's IGA here in Parkview. I recall countless grocery store trips with my parents, slushes in the summer, the excitement of going for a walk and coming home with a chocolate bar or bag of chips (and sometimes both). In elementary school my class went on a field trip by crossing the street from Parkview School to IGA, where we got a tour of the entire store - including the back of the meat section. It was so cold, but to a group of young kids it was also quite exciting to see all of the huge cuts of meat waiting to be butchered into smaller pieces.

I continued to shop there regularly. It was the only grocery store within walking distance of my home. The kosher dry goods aisle, frozen meat, and wall of packaged hot dogs and deli have served Edmonton's Jewish community, including my family, for decades. In fact, when I, along with countless neighbours, think of Andy's IGA, "community" is the first word to come to mind. The store was owned by a community member - I went to school for a time with Andy's and Gerrie's kids - and the store employed many local folks. Andy's IGA is part of Parkview's/Valleyview's/Crestwood's identity.

But what is my most cherished memory of this neighbourhood icon? The coin-operated rocking horse. I remember my parents lifting me up to put me on her (I always considered the horse to be a "her") and being so scared the first time. Later, I would get on myself. If I had no coins, I would just rock back and forth. Sometimes the horse would not work, even if I had coins. One time that happened, another kid told me it was because I was too "big" (as in, "old"). I think I was maybe 12 at the time.

Yes, I admit, I probably rode her longer than other kids, and I would ride her now if I weren't concerned about actually breaking the mechanism. She's looking good for her age - I think she's had a coat of paint and other restorations, but she has always been beautiful.

I'm heartened to learn that L'OCA Quality Market, which is soon to fill the space, will be keeping the kosher section and the beloved horse. She is a reminder of the past and how all of us who have lived in this area for any length of time will carry a piece of Andy's IGA with us forever.
