2014 Summer Solstice Food Truck Event

You've heard the expression, 'A picture is worth a thousand words.' Well, apparently everyone was too busy enjoying great gourmet food and having fun, to snap even a single photo of this great community event. So if you want to see what the 2014 food truck event looked like, please read the somewhat less than 1000 words that follow as I try to create a mental picture.

Ideal would be the best descriptive for the weather that day. It was warm, with a slight north-west breeze. The sun shone brightly in a cloudless sky, filtering down through the trees, illuminating the lush greens of the park in early summer.

Families began to congregate in the park and playground at about 4pm while organizers and volunteers were setting up tables, and directing food trucks to designated parking spots on the basketball court. Inside the centre in the main hall, guests

enjoyed browsing a collection of water color paintings displayed by Parkview artist, Brian Ferguson.

By 4:30 there were picnic blankets and lawn chairs sprinkled throughout the park where folks had staked out their spots for the evening. Toes tapped and heads nodded to the beat of the music, broadcast through PVCL's newly acquired sound system. The delicious fragrance of food began to waft across the park, and guests began to wander over to check out the mouth watering menus offered by four food trucks: Greek food from Little Village Food Truck, unique gourmet sandwiches and desserts at S'Wich, authentic Mexican food from Casa12Doce and an amazing variety of hot dogs and sausages from Franks.

At 5pm the food truck shutters were rolled up signalling trucks were open for business. A bar – operated by volunteers of PVCL – provided drinks for the evening. Food and drink sales were brisk. Over the course of four hours, the food trucks sold from 1200 – 1300 servings to more than 400 people. Comments circulating throughout the crowd could be summarized as, "Yummy, that was great" and "Did you try....?"

The food and drinks were great, but the best part of the evening was that it provided the opportunity for neighbors, friends, and family to come together to visit, relax and work together. The event was incredibly well attended, and many stepped up to volunteer for setup, cleanup, bartend, and sell tickets. What a testimony to the strength and unity of our community of Parkview!

If you weren't at this event and feel like you 'missed out', don't despair. We have already booked another food truck event for next year. Mark your calendar for June 20, 2015. Same time, same place, same great people. Maybe next time someone will actually take a picture or two.



Parkview Preschool is in the process of developing a new logo for our program. Along with this logo, we are also changing our name from Preschool to Preschool. We believe that this change highlights the type of program that is being implemented. The primary purpose of preschool is to aid in your child's social, emotional, physical and intellectual development. While 'play' is still an important part of this process, it is important to note that there are many structured learning activities also taking place each day.

For those new to the community, Parkview Preschool is a non-profit, parent cooperative school that is located on the 2nd floor of the Parkview Community League. We have 3 different classes for the upcoming school year. We have a 3-year-old class on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, a 4-year-old class on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings, and a 3/4 blend class on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons. The afternoon blend class has the 3 year olds attending Monday and Wednesdays and the 4 year olds attending all three afternoons. We currently do not have spots available in any of our classes but if you are interested in getting on to our waiting list, please contact our registrar, Kathy Newman at kjnewman@shaw.ca.

Parkview Preschool is directed by a volunteer executive and is a sub-group of the Parkview Community League. As a non-profit parent cooperative, all parents are required to volunteer for one toy wash per year and one fund-raising activity. As well, parents are asked to contribute or donate occasional supplies, assist with fieldtrips, special events and have the option to participate on the Executive Board.

Our teacher, Merri-Ann Wojcicki, and Educational Assistants, Marnie Roch and Leanne Howard, achieve the goals of the Parkview Preschool through classroom activities, such as:

- Free play allowing children to create, explore, share, problem-solve, play cooperatively, etc
- Calendar, weather, etc
- Story time, sing-a-long and action songs, etc
- Exercise, games and gym-time
- Music and stories on tape and rhythm instruments
- Crafts, painting, colouring, cutting, creating
- "Show and Share" and "Busy Bee" responsibilities
- Class parties on special days throughout the year
- Field trips, special events and invited visitors
- School readiness skills

QUESTIONS I'M ASKED ABOUT FEEDING BIRDS

Q: Why do some of the birds look so scruffy?

Many birds molt during this time of year. Found a feather or two in your yard? It's most likely an old one being replaced. Feathers are responsible for more than just a bird's ability to fly; they provide weather protection, making a bird virtually waterproof, as well as insulation for cold weather, especially during winter. However, feathers wear out and need to be replaced. This process is called molting.

Typically, birds molt feathers in regular patterns or on specific parts of their bodies, and it may take weeks or months for birds to complete the molting cycle. They shed their flight feathers symmetrically, the first one or two on each wing at the same time, then the next one or two and so on, so they can molt wing feathers without affecting their ability to fly. Body feathers may be shed in tracts or sections. Sometimes Blue Jays will molt head feathers in groups and look "bald." Most of our backyard bird visitors molt from July to September. They are looking for highquality foods to help them grow their feathers.



Q: What kind of foods do molting birds need?

The main building blocks to grow new feathers are proteins and fats. Young birds and older molting birds seek highprotein foods to grow their feathers as they are made up of more than 90% protein. Birds also need foods with fat. This supplies energy to grow feathers and provide proper colouration to feathers to best attract a mate. If they lack these proper nutrients, it could be a difficult winter and a lonely spring! You can help molting birds and more readily attract them with foods high in protein and fat like Bark Butter Bits, Bark Butter, peanuts, tree nuts, and sunflower chips.

Q: What is the best place to put my bird feeder?

Locate your feeder near tree branches or other perches so they can land prior to going on the feeder. Watch the birds as they flit around your yard, and you will notice that each species of bird has a different pattern of movement and favourite perching spots or types of tree cover that they prefer. Lilac bushes, cedar hedges, and spruce trees are good for them to roost in. To help prevent birds from striking windows, place your feeder either within I metre of a window, or at least 3 metres from your house. If the feeder is close to the window,

the birds are flying slowly enough that it is unlikely they will injure themselves if they fly into the glass. If cats visit your yard, keep feeders away from fences or places from which cats can pounce. A pole to hang your feeder near tree perches but away from cat friendly launching pads is a good solution, and makes it easy for you to fill your feeder. If you have no trees, a pole system with a few metal branches for the birds to land on gives them a safe place from which to inspect the feeders. Put the feeder where you can easily see it from your house so you can enjoy the birds!


