



Over 30 years ago, some women got together to play basketball for fun - and the basketball is still going. We run, shoot, pass, laugh, and hang out with friends. It's a fun workout with no keeping score. The end of the game is signalled by: "Next basket ties it!"

Parkview Ladies Sports Nite (aka Parkview Shooting Stars) includes women of all levels of basketball abilities. Everyone passes to everyone, and we all cheer when anyone scores. Our average player is between 40 and 60, and there are older and younger people.

Some women resisted the pull for years. When they finally came, their major regret was that they didn't start sooner.

You need non-scuff runners and a water bottle. We play on Thursday nights from September to May, usually at Lynnwood Elementary School. It's drop-in. Teams are different every game. Fees are \$60 for the year to cover gym rental. Come and try the first couple of sessions for free.

PARKVIEW RESIDENTS ARE FIGHTING BACK AGAINST IRRESPONSIBLE INFILL DEVELOPMENT

A growing chorus of communities across Edmonton, including Parkview, is raising alarm over the City's new Zoning Bylaw 20001, that came into effect January 1, 2024. This bylaw stripped Parkview of its protective 'Mature Neighbourhood Overlay', introducing drastic changes to infill development that risk ruining the character of our neighbourhood.

Our City now allows small apartment buildings - up to 8 units and 3 storeys high - and other high-density housing, with no limits on the number of units per street, no parking requirements, and no regard for the burden on emergency access or utility infrastructure. Worse, "permitted" developments are automatically approved without public input or appeal. Our voices are being silenced.

A grassroots movement of engaged residents is uniting to protect and shape our neighbourhood's future. We advocate for sensible, character-respecting development, rejecting top-down zoning changes and unchecked densification. Our goal: inform and unite our community to establish clear, legally protected, community-driven guidelines that preserve Parkview not just now but for the generations that come after.
