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PARKVIEW RESIDENT AIMS FOR "10K EVERY DAY"

Michelle Pollock walks at least 10 km every day.

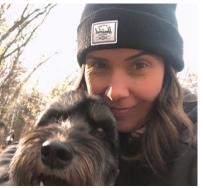
"When I turned 50, a voice inside my head kept whispering, 'Fit at Fifty.' It motivated me to make changes and get into better shape. Knowing myself, I didn't want to commit to five days a week at the gym, and my knees reminded me that my running days were behind me," she says.

Michelle joined a weight loss program with her sister in January 2023. They would arrive early at West Edmonton Mall to avoid rush hour traffic and pass the time by walking and window shopping. "We were shocked to discover that two laps around one level of the mall added up to 5 km. By mid-April, we were meeting at the mall almost daily, often for two hours at a stretch. That's when the light bulb went off: 10K Everyday became my goal - and my motto."

That spring, the sisters explored their communities by choosing routes they could complete in 2 to 2.5 hours. This led to many adventures in the west end and beyond, including crossing every bridge from Quesnel to Walterdale in one walk, as well as adventures closer to home like taking in the lights at Candy Cane Lane. "We walked as far as the Tawatinâ Bridge in Riverdale and looped back past the Edmonton River Queen to Parkview in a single trip. In St. Albert, we walked 17 km from Kingswood to Big Lake and back." Michelle adds.

Michelle has adopted the policies of "walk while you wait" and "walk if you can." For example, she will walk in airports while waiting to board and will walk instead of driving whenever possible. "I make a point of going for walks with friends and family instead of just sitting and visiting. I even walked home from Norden Volkswagen on St. Albert Trail and 137 Ave. one day when my car needed an oil change!"





Over the last 2.5 years, Michelle has walked an average of 14.5 km daily, which translates to around 21,500 steps daily. The most she has walked in a single day is 43 km (split across three walks). She has gone through 10 pairs of running shoes and has only missed one day with a case of the stomach flu. She makes sure to dress for the weather but will head to WEM if it is colder than -20 Celcius or if it is icy, windy, or smoky outside. "Sometimes I listen to music, sometimes podcasts or audiobooks, and sometimes I just allow myself to be alone with my thoughts. I walk with friends, family, alone, but most often with my Labradoodle, Areo. I love to start and end the day with a walk."

As advice for others who may wish to take the first "steps" towards better fitness, she says: "The greatest lesson I have learned on this journey is that consistency beats intensity. Doing something every day, no matter how simple it is, can change your life. Setting a goal - and truly committing to it - can transform your body, mind, and connection to your community in ways you never imagined.
